Tennis NSW is also offering registered players a discount of up to \$10 on all sessions. The Medibank International 2008, held at the Sydney Olympic Park Tennis Centre from *January 6 - 12*, is the premier lead-in event to the Australian Open. The Medibank International is also far more than a tennis tournament - it is Sydney's biggest summer tennis party with plenty of off-court action including bands and roving entertainers, theme days, giveaways and all the fun of Fanfest.

Tickets officially go on sale on September 12 through Ticketek, but as a Tennis NSW registered player, you can jump the queue - and also purchase tickets at a discount rate. (Sunday January 6 – Saturday January 12 @ Sydney Olympic Park Tennis Centre)

Member Admin – 07/08 Renewals & Detail changes:

Membership year is from 1st September 2007 - 31st August 2008.

Full Playing (\$400) - Includes: Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday, Sunday and Pub. Hols. (Courts that are vacant outside of these days are free to use, but be mindful any paid booking will have priority)

Restricted Playing (\$250) – As per full playing but no Saturday tennis.

Junior/Student (\$150) - as for full playing. Juniors to 21 yrs. Full time students to 25 yrs.

Overseas/Interstate (\$150) - Designed for members frequently away from Manly

Social (\$25) – for non-playing and “Mid-week Competition” players.

Joining fee: \$80 (Senior), \$40 (Junior / Student)

Fees for new members are levied pro rata for the number of quarters remaining to the 31st August. These fees include: GST, Competition fees and Registration with Tennis NSW. The club has no ball fee charges for playing in club social times, or badge competitions. There is an afternoon tea charge for Badge players when playing at home.

Visitor Fee (\$10/visit) – max. 6 visits within a year. Requires permission of a Committee member and the player should be of club tennis standard.

Coach's Corner

Beating big servers:

How do you approach a match against someone with a huge serve?

I think going into the match you have to realise that if you're playing someone like Wayne Arthurs you're not going to get a whole lot of chances to break, and you can't get frustrated. If you get a break point and they hit an ace or something like that, you've got to be really mentally tough and patient. Also you've really got to be tough on your own serve. You can't play any loose points on your own serve.

You've got to really work hard early in the games meaning try to get the first point on your serve or get to 30 first on your serve. And on their serve the same thing. If you go down 30-0 you're facing a tough battle to break. So they're a couple of the most important things. But not getting frustrated by their ability to serve their way out of trouble is a very big thing.

Is there a particularly effective way to return big serves or is it just a matter of getting it back?

I think you probably start off returning normally but then you might change your stance a bit. Sometimes on a second serve stand in a slightly different position, make them think a bit on their serve. Don't let them just get up and be on autopilot and hit their spots. You've got to make them think. You've got to start to pick their serve by their ball toss and try to find little things in their action that gives you an extra split second to see where their serve is going.

How do you counter-attack big servers?

Generally big servers aren't as solid from the back. Like a Wayne Arthurs-type player, his groundstrokes probably are not his strength. If you can get the return back into a neutral position you've got a good chance of winning the point. The other situation is you play a big server who does have good groundstrokes but maybe they're not ever going to serve and volley. If you can find a way to get the return back you know that they're not coming in after it and it sort of eases your mind in a little bit that way. It's tough playing a big server and it can be frustrating so I think going out on the court you've certainly got to be in the right mindset.

Nine Basic Facts about Strings:

Here are basic facts about strings provided by the U.S. Racquet Stringers Association:

- ✓ Lower string tensions generate more power (providing string movement does not occur).
- ✓ Higher string tensions generate more ball control (for experienced players).
- ✓ A longer string length (or string plane area) produces more power.
- ✓ Decreased string density (fewer strings) generates more power.
- ✓ Thinner string generates more power (Wilson's research for their Sweet spot string disputes this theory).
- ✓ More elastic strings generate more power (generally, what will produce more power will also absorb more shock load at impact).
- ✓ Softer strings, or strings with a softer coating, tend to vibrate less.
- ✓ Thinner strings tend to produce more spin.
- ✓ Decreased string density (fewer strings) generates more spin.

The 2007 Spring Badge competition will **commence on Saturday 22nd September**. Entry forms will be available for download from the Badge section of the Tennis NSW website. Entries close Monday 3rd September.

The Structure of the 2007 Spring Badge competition is as follows:

- ❖ Two separate competitions will be conducted -
 - Doubles Only; and Singles & Doubles
- ❖ Matches will be played from –
 - 1:00 - 3:00pm (Doubles Only comp)
 - 3:05 - 5:35pm (Singles & Doubles comp)
- ❖ The format for both comps will be –
 - played on one court,
 - for one round,
 - comprised of six (6) unisex teams of two (2) persons only, and
 - limited to a maximum of three (3) registered players per team.
- ❖ Each match will be –
 - Doubles only - Three (3) consecutive tie break (5 all) sets of doubles,
 - Singles & Doubles - Four (4) tie break (5 all) sets played in the following order unless agreed otherwise by the captains,
 - Set 1 – Doubles,
 - Set 2 - No.1 Singles,
 - Set 3 - No. 2 Singles, and
 - Set 4 - Doubles
- ❖ The teams finishing 1st and 2nd at the end of the five (5) rounds will play a finals match only on the leading team's home court.
- ❖ All competitors must be registered members of Tennis NSW.

This year, the big day is **Friday 7th September 2007**. The final match play format & draw will be finalised according to a formula including player numbers, spanners in a tool set, and the alignment of the planets in order to ensure sufficient time per match, to allow swift progress for each round.

The handicapping system will be less simple, but exceptionally fair, with the transparency and right of redress akin to that in use by the NSW State Debt Recovery Office. Again, a 'knock-up, knock-down' system will be in play where your team's initial results in the preliminary rounds will position you for the final tilt at either 'Cup', 'Shield', or 'Bowl'. Basically, your team will always be playing for something up to and including the final rounds.

This tournament will be organized via email, so watch for email from me advising details, nominations, and the like. A sign-up sheet will on the main notice boards for all to sign up to.
